MOBILE STAIRLIFT



Living in public housing can present issues for those with disabilities. Unfortunately, public housing authorities are not allowed to use permanent stair lifts. Public housing was established to provide decent and safe rental housing for eligible low-income families, the elderly, and persons with disabilities. Public housing comes in all sizes and types, from scattered single-family houses to high rise apartments for elderly families. **There are approximately 1.2 million households living in public housing units, managed by some 3300 PHAs**.



NYC Case Study

The average NYCHA building is around 50 years old, and with 3,193 elevators, that's approximately 3.2 million trips a day. In 2018, there were 44,000 total elevator outages, averaging 121 breakdowns per day. Since roughly 50% of NYCHA residential buildings are 7 stories or more, and about 9% are buildings of 17-31 stories, there is a serious need for mobility solutions for staircases.


